Attention CCSP Participants

Reminder: SSI program updates will continue to be offered via the CCSP WebBoard. Please refer to this site regularly for additional program information.

Technology Training: CCSFs that use cargo screening technology must be adequately trained on screening procedures prior to shipping any screened cargo. TSA has developed guidance for use throughout screening technology training and encourages entities to seek training from industry partners that are experienced with the use of cargo screening technology. For specific information regarding cargo screening technology, please access the CCSP WebBoard or contact your regional PCSA.

STA Fees: CCSF Security Coordinators, cargo screeners, and individuals who have unescorted access to screened cargo must pass a Security Threat Assessment (STAs). Shippers and ICSFs must process STAs through TSA's STA Tool (STAT). IAC CCSFs process STAs through the IAC Management System (IACMS).

At this time, there is no charge being levied for STAs, but please be aware that facilities will soon have to pay a fee for each STA. Per the IFR §1540.209, TSA will issue a Notice in the Federal Register establishing the final STA fee amount. TSA will alert facilities once the Notice has been issued.

Attention certified shippers: TSA will post a list of certified Indirect Air Carriers (IACs) and Independent Cargo Screening Facilities (ICSFs) to its public-facing website. A list of freight forwarders that do **not** perform screening but can transport/maintain proper chain of custody will also be included. This will allow shippers to verify certified facilities within the supply chain and confirm their status as a certified facility or entity that can provide secure transport. The list will be limited to basic information, i.e. facility name, city, and state.

Note: Each CCSF IAC/ICSF has the choice to opt-out of the public list during the certification process.





TSA's Qualified Technology List Posted Online

TSA is pleased to announce that a Non-Sensitive Security Information (SSI) version of the TSA Air Cargo Screening Technology List version 2.0 has been posted online and can be found at http://www.tsa.gov/assets/pdf/non_ssi_qtl.pdf.

This list indicates the technologies that can be used by air carriers, indirect air carriers, independent cargo screening facilities, and shippers in the Certified Cargo Screening Program to screen for domestic and outbound (of the United States) air cargo. This list contains **Qualified** and **Approved** technologies, their manufacturer, model number, top assembly part number, and expiration dates for each cargo screening technology. **Qualified** technologies have undergone a formal TSA sponsored test process and are deemed qualified for 5 years from date of qualification. **Approved** technologies are conditionally approved for 36 months from the date added to the technology list and are currently undergoing further testing.

Please reference this list if you are interested in buying technology for your CCSF. Before making any purchases, you should also consult with your PCSA and the SSI version of the technology list.


